Catering such as morning coffee, light lunch and afternoon tea can be provided for groups by prior arrangement.

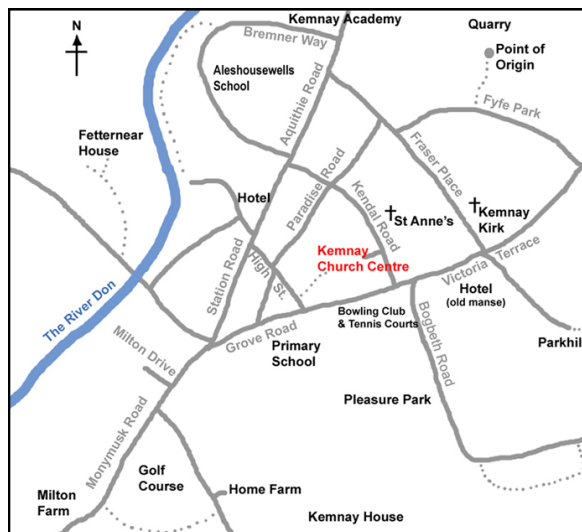
All kitchen activities, food storage and preparation comply with hygiene standards and all kitchen and coffee shop staff are appropriately trained.

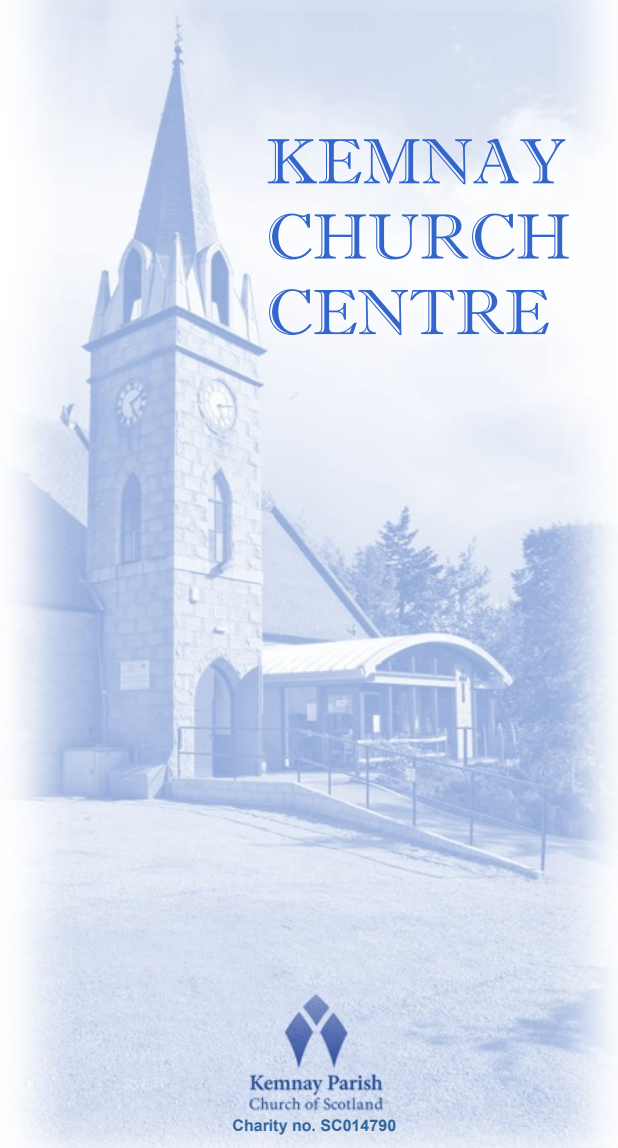
How to find us

A Warm Welcome to the Kemnay Church Centre

The Church Centre was opened in December 2000 as the Millennium Project of Kemnay Parish Church of Scotland. The main building was a former United Free Church and in 1935 became the hall facility for the parish church. The building has been fully refurbished and extended to provide extensive accommodation for church and community activities. Although its primary use is for church based groups it is the Congregational Board's wish to make the Centre available to the wider community and other congregations.

The Centre is run by a management committee to ensure the building is maintained to a high standard and meets the requirements of all those who use it. The proceeds from letting the facility to external groups go towards maintenance and ongoing improvements and allow the Centre to be financially self supporting. The Centre is non-profit making and is run by volunteers.

The Accommodation

The following provides an overview of what is available within the Centre.

The Fellowship Hall

can accommodate up to 200 people with seating for 160. There is direct access to the kitchen facilities and it is equipped with an audio system and loop induction. It also has a regulation size badminton court.



The Centre also boasts a Boston Steinway piano which can be used for performances in the Fellowship Hall or the Millennium Hall.

The Millennium Hall

This hall can seat up to 80 people and there is direct access to the kitchen.



Lounge/Meeting Room

A comfortable downstairs lounge with patio doors opening out to the grounds.



Chapel/Quiet Room

A place for quiet meditation open during coffee shop hours. It can also be used for meetings.



Donaldson Room

For smaller meetings. It also functions as a resource centre with a range of reference material and a photocopier.



Kitchen

Well appointed including a commercial gas hob, a separate electric baking oven and a commercial dishwasher.
